

About Invitations to Comment

The Courts are required to periodically review their Local Rules to ensure they are current and in compliance with existing statutes, state rules, and local practices. Once an existing rule has been approved for revision or a new rule approved for addition to the Local Rules, it must be published for public comment.

The "Invitation to Comment" process starts when the proposed revisions are posted on the website and notice given to various agencies, organizations, and interested parties as required by rule 10.613(g), California Rules of Court. Parties are asked to review the proposals and provide feedback as to their content.

Comments must be submitted in writing and may be submitted by letter mailed or faxed to the Chair of the Rules & Forms Committee or by web form (link provided below). Information on where to submit comments will be provided when a comment cycle begins.

Each comment cycle will have a deadline when comments must be submitted. It is important to adhere to this deadline; comments received after the deadline may not be considered by the Rules & Forms Committee.

The Rules & Forms Committee will review the comments and submit their final recommendations on the proposed rule changes to the Presiding Judge. The recommended rule changes are then placed on a ballot for majority approval by the judges.
